MB103 Library of Andrew Macmillan - numismatic and general financial reference works relating to Scotland, Britain etc.

Many years ago we sold Andrew Macmillan's token auction and before the pandemic had promised to arrange the sale of his numismatic library. The Scottish collector passed away in January this year and so here are his books, his working copies, some photocopies and general reference works on financial history.

We don't normally sell books and don't intend to branch out into that numismatic speciality in the future. However, a promise is a promise even if we are trying to gradually retire. Everything has to go. As a point of interest, the meticulous account register of his entire Scottish collections (coins, communion tokens, paper money, checks etc) is going to the Hunterian at the University of Glasgow for future study.

There are over 200 books relating to tokens, paper money and financial documents, Scottish, British, American and Canadian mainly. There are also numerous photocopies of books which Andrew annotated rather than writing in the book. As you might expect there's every reference work you could hope to have on communion church tokens, either in the original or the photocopy.

Do use the key word and category search facility on the internet and read right through the catalogue. There are crossovers between the categories especially on place names and themes; you may miss things otherwise.

All bidding will be done online with the usual closing time from 12 noon. You will need to register to bid and give yourself a user name. While you need to provide a debit or credit card to register, when you purchase from us you will have other options for payment. From the 'My Account' section you will be able to see what bids you're winning or losing, and can view your 'watch' list too. Please be sure to add our email address to your contacts (otherwise alerts from us may not reach you or end up in your junk folder).

If you do not have access to the internet, we can bid on your behalf as long as we receive instructions by Monday 16 May in the post or by email, so you won't lose out with the new system. However, it is much, much better all round if you bid online.

Increments: Bids will increase in the following way: £1-£20 £1 increments £20-£40 £2 increments £40-£100 £5 increments

£100 onwards £10 increments.

The auction uses proxy bidding so that you only see the current winning bid, not someone's maximum bid (think eBay). There won't be tied bids in the future - if someone else has bid your maximum before you, they win unless, offline bidders, we have your instruction to increase your bid by a set number of increments e.g. 1 or 2 bids. There's no third party sniping facility but of course you can bid up to (almost) the closing time online. Be aware though that once the auction is calculating winning bids at the end you may not be able to place last minute bids. You will get an alert by email for lots won; at that point go to My Account and checkout 'bids won'. That then creates an order and gives you options to pay. For our sanity we're **not charging a buyer's premium**. Also it may help our overseas buyers if faced with import charges.

The price online is the reserve if no bids registered. We reckon this is roughly half estimated price, or in the case of rare items, a bargain start. So bid high, and bid early please!
